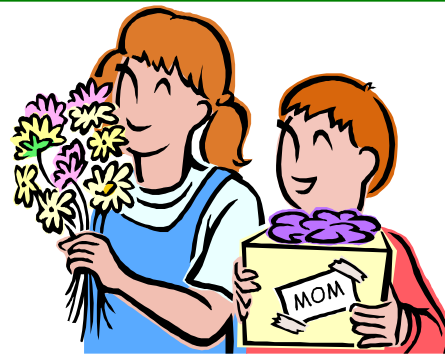

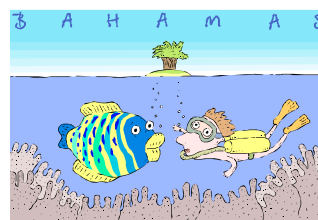


Project Service Hours
